2. Corporate Law

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Module Annotation

Corporate law has always been the cornerstone of commercial law. The module provides important information about the establishment, foundation and dissolution of business corporations. The audience will be presented with individual types of business corporations, including their specifics. At the same time, the module deals with the status of statutory bodies in individual corporations and defines their obligations and responsibilities.

Module Objective

The aim of the module is to provide a comprehensive overview of business corporations with a focus on business companies, through which business or non-business interest can be implemented, including the process of their establishment, foundation and dissolution.

The corporate issue is broad and offers a wealth of legal and factual problems associated with different types of companies. The module aims to offer a typology of companies, to introduce their characteristics and to highlight some of the above issues. It is not clear which of the types of companies is the most appropriate and the best, because each type of company represents advantages and disadvantages, both in its structure and in its "usability" for the business environment or other purpose. The aim of the module is also to provide general information about individual institutes associated with companies such as deeds of incorporation, share, share capital, etc.
